SPRITZ COOKIES

cup butter or margarine, softened
cup sugar
1/4 cups all-purpose flour
teaspoon salt
egg
teaspoon almond extract or vanilla

Heat oven to 400 degrees. Cream butter and sugar. Blend in the remaining ingredients. Fill cookie press with 1/4 dough at a time; form desired shapes on ungreased baking sheet. If desired, add a candy accent to the center of your "flowers."

Bake 6 to 9 minutes or until set, but not brown. Makes 5 dozen cookies.

If you don't have a cookie press, you can be creative and free-form these treats. And if you want, you can send AVHH a picture and we'll put it in the next newsletter!

For Tricia, life has come full circle. Conceived in Colorado when her dad was in the Air Force, she was hauled (along with her pregnant mother, obviously) to Michigan, where she was born. Later, her first

husband dragged her off from Michigan to central Texas. While there, Tricia operated a childcare center for many years and started in prison ministry.

Following her divorce, she spent 21 years in Oklahoma, where she went to college after attaining a GED (she'd previously only had an 8th grade education). Once she entered college, within eight years she had two bachelors degrees and one masters in mental health counseling, plus she became a state-licensed school teacher. After her second husband died in 2010, she came back to Colorado. As she says, "It took 60 years to get me back home!" She shares her Nathrop home with Mattee, her little white, fluffy Pomeranian.

"AVHH is wonderful! Because of scoliosis in my back, there's a lot I can't do. AVHH has put in new window screens, tacked down carpet, and weeded, which keeps me from getting in trouble with the HOA. And the food bags are such nice surprises! They make me feel special and not forgotten. It's like Christmas!"
